## DSH-C Hospital Specific Contraband Justification

  - Musical instruments/ accessories may not be constructed primarily of metal (excluding guitar strings)
  - Musical instruments/ accessories may not have recording capabilities
  - Guitar strings are a one for one exchange
  - Musical instrument cases must be made of a flexible nylon type material, a foam reinforced structure is acceptable
  - One case per instrument
  - Cases may not contain a locking mechanism
  - A limit of two (2) sets of drumsticks per patient
  - Drumsticks must be stored in the Nurses Station in accordance with Unit Security (AD 838)
  - One (1) set of drumsticks must be stored in Patient Property
  - Amplifiers must be utilized with headphones
  - No mixers or loopers are permitted
  - · Pedals must be primarily made of plastic
  - Guitar straps shall not exceed fifty-six (56) inches in total length. Limit of one (1) per patient.

Musical instruments must be stored in approved areas as described in Patient Living Ares AD 834 and cannot obstruct, egress, or present a tripping hazard. All musical accessories must be approved by the patients Treatment Team and Unit Supervisor prior to purchase.

  - Flags can be no larger than 3" x 5"

Flags must be hung flat on a wall and are not permitted to be hung from the ceiling, light fixtures, privacy curtains or cabinets. Flags are a Unit Supervisor pick-up item.
