This notice announces a Second 15-day comment period in which the public may comment on the modifications to the originally proposed text for the sexually violent predator standardized assessment protocol regulation. This notice is issued pursuant to Government Code section 11346.8, subsection (c), California Code of Regulations, title 1, section 44, and Government Code section 11347.1.

This regulatory action was originally noticed and published in the California Regulatory Notice Register and was also mailed on December 8, 2017 to all interested parties. No action by the public is necessary unless persons wish to comment on the proposed modified text.

SUMMARY OF MODIFICATIONS

The text of the modified regulatory language is shown in Attachment 1. The originally proposed regulatory language is shown in plain text. The modifications proposed as part of the Second 15-day changes are shown in double underline to indicate addition, and double strikethrough to show deletion.

The following Second 15-day modifications were made to the Regulation Text:

<u>In Section 4012,</u> a sentence has been modified to clarify that sexual interest tests, which are part of the medical record, may also be considered in the assessment review, in accordance to the general professional practice.

<u>In Section 4013(b)</u>, a sentence was added to clarify that interviews conducted by video telepsychiatry is also considered a face-to-face interview. As technology advances, the medical practice is changing and incorporating technology into the standard professional practice.

<u>In Section 4013(c)</u>, minor changes have been made to ensure proper references, and to clarify that the evaluator should attempt to get informed consent. There is also a renumbering which cleans up the regulations.

In Section 4014(e)(1)(A)2., a sentence was added to ensure that there was no confusion regarding a person who had been convicted as a mentally disordered sex offender. This is a repeat of the statute, included to make clear that this is something that needs to be considered.

In Section 4014(e)(2)(D)4., there was an addition to ensure that the results of sexual interest testing may be reviewed.

<u>In Section 4014.1</u>, language was added to clarify when the evaluations are completed and certified and are official reports pursuant to the responsibility of the department to ensure that reports are provided pursuant to the SVP law.

In addition to the modifications described above, additional modifications correcting grammar, changes in numbering and formatting have been made to improve clarity. These changes are nonsubstantive.
